Church Damage Latest



Work has started on making the church safe by removing some of the large granite blocks that were still perched on the roof and covering up the holes there to prevent rain and snow from coming in.

BBC Spotlight featured the incident on its broadcasts yesterday. DId you spot the local film stars? There is also an item about it on the BBC webpages. As will be gathered from these, it is not yet known whether insurance will pay for the repair work but this will clearly involve a large sum of money. Initial estimates are indicating that this could be in the order of £500,000 for this Grade I listed building.

Late last night (21-1-13) Pillaton church was damaged by a lightning bolt that destroyed the NE pinnacle on the tower. Flying masonry made several holes in the church roof and damaged fixtures and fittings inside. One stone also broke a bench outside The Weary Friar. Fortunately no one was hurt in the incident.

Please do not attempt to go into the church, or stand to close to it, until the damage has been stabilised. There is still a risk of stones falling.
