PILLATON RECYCLING DAY CHANGING TO A WEDNESDAY

Cornwall County Council's (CCC) new rubbish and recycling scheme comes into force for Pillaton on Wednesday 10 April. Instead of Tuesdays, collections of rubbish and recycling will now be made on Wednesdays with the new scheme seeing food waste collected weekly, whilst recycling and household rubbish is collected fortnightly, on alternate weeks. Also, it appears the new collection day is going to apply to the whole parish including outlying areas such as Polborder, Paynter's Cross and Pentillie. Garden waste will continue to be collected as before. Collection timetables will shortly be sent out by the council, and these can also be viewed on the CCC website. Below is a pictorial description of what should happen over the first few weeks of the new scheme and see page 21 for a list of collection dates over the next two months.

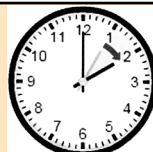

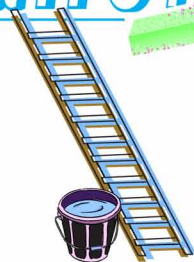

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the D-Day Normandy Landings in June 1944. Code named Operation NEPTUNE the landings were the opening phase of the much wider Operation OVERLORD, which resulted in the liberation of north-west Europe. Sadly, due to the passage of time the vast majority of the combatants are no longer with us. Even the youngest participants will now be in their very late 90s, but it doesn't stop us remembering their brave actions on 6 June 1944 and the weeks following as well as all those thousands of men and women that acted in their support.

Changing the subject completely and with no disrespect to D-Day veterans. Next month, here in southeast Cornwall, we are anticipating something I have codenamed B-Day (wheelie-Bin Day), although having just written that down I've realised there could be some confusion with French bathrooms in the unlikely event you should read this editorial aloud to an elderly relative.

Back to B-Day. Over the past few months, in an operation masterminded from a headquarters in Truro, preparations have been meticulously made for the largest gathering of wheelie bins Cornwall has ever seen. For weeks now, the new bins have been clandestinely dropped off on driveways and pavements across the county whilst plans have been posted through the letterbox of every home or mysteriously appeared in green food bins.

In our part of Cornwall, the operation commences during the second week of April and for Pillaton the key date, B-Day, is Wednesday 10 April. The first bins to hit the pavement that day will be the green food waste ones, as yet inexperienced and untried in action, but never fear in support they will have backup from those trusty and seasoned campaigners the red, blue, and orange recycling bags, not forgetting the black box in reserve. The following Wednesday, 17 April, the grey household rubbish wheelie bins go into the front line, plus returning to the fray, as they will every week, the green food bins. Meanwhile the brown garden waste bins will just continue to follow the old pattern of collection as before. Just in case I've thoroughly confused anyone with my B-Day flight of fancy please see the revised recycling set out on page 21 or double-check the Council website.

Finally, I suppose with all this change it's just possible that one day a much loved and cherished black plastic dustbin from Cornwall will appear at the doors of the "The Repair Shop" for some tender restoration. There are bound to be tears when the sheet is whisked away to reveal the trusty bin in all its former glory, bringing back all those happy family memories when Mum and Dad used to put the rubbish out.

Enough rubbish, the next copy date is 6 May - full details on page 23.

MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 6 FEBRUARY 2024

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST None

PUBLIC FORUM

There were three members of the public present.

Mrs Warwick outlined the history of the acquisition of the hand bells but said the ownership of the bells was uncertain. Mrs Warwick also said that the hand bell group planned to purchase hand chime bells by applying for a grant from the solar farm. However, in order to do so the hand bell constitution must include a declaration that, in the instance of the group winding up, a long term existing body (namely the Parish Council) would supervise the disposal of the bells for the benefit of the Parish. The Council agreed that the hand bell constitution be amended accordingly to include such a declaration.

MINUTES

The minutes of the 1 January 2024 Council meeting were accepted unanimously.

MATTERS ARISING

a) Trough in the Row

The Council accepted that the matter was in the hands of the local Cornwall Highways engineer who was aware of the problem.

b) Web Site Maintenance

The Council decided to continue advertising for a volunteer to maintain the Council web site.

c) Clapper Bridge

The Chairman informed the Council that he considered that St Mellion Council were now fully aware of the issues surrounding damage to the bridge and could be relied upon to support any safeguarding measures relating to the bridge. The repair to the bridge was planned for March 2024.

TREE IN CHURCHYARD

The Chairman told the Council that he had been invited to attend a meeting in the Church yard with the Parochial Church Council and a tree surveyor to examine the large beech tree which in part hung over the Village Hall. The surveyor advised that the tree be examined and photographed for movement every three months accompanied by a density test, explaining that the removal of a large branch would kill the tree. Despite this assurance the Council believed that a danger to the public and the Hall continued.

PLANNING PERMISSION None

FINANCE

There were no payments.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Clerk was asked to report the gravel washed down Trewashford Lane causing an obstruction.

The Clerk was asked to request St Mellion Parish Council to seek pruning of the hedges leading to the weir.

SAFETY INSPECTION

The Chair informed the Council a safety inspection by ROSPA was booked for April.

PLANNING PERMISSION

The Council approved planning application PA24/01251 for a proposed extension of existing caravan storage at High Kernock for Mr. G. Moore.

FINANCE

The Council approved the following payments, £180 Inland Revenue, £720 Clerks salary, Cllr Ley £64.99 for Norton Software.

The Clerk was asked to report pot holes at the bottom of Darkey Lane and a loose branch on the hill to Landrake.

PILLATON ARTS AND CRAFTS GROUP

The Pillaton Arts and Crafts Group (PAAC) was conceived in 2012 when Don and Jo King, Wendy Wyatt and Alison Downing, all artists themselves, believed that their interest was worth sharing with others. Don and Jo then set up the group which continued to grow and extend the range of its activities in the years which followed.

After the deaths of Don in 2022 and Jo in 2023 a new committee was formed who determined to ensure that the legacy left by the Kings continued to thrive into the future.

Results of the group's activities include the mosaic Armistice Tree on the Village Hall store, the poppy mosaics in the Village Hall foyer, several exhibitions which have been held to display some of the work done by the group and many entries in the art and handicrafts sections of the Garden Club Summer Show. A subsidiary quilting group produced the wonderful Mayflower Quilt also in the hall and the 'Knit and Natter' group have decorated the churchyard with knitted poppies for Remembrance Day.



The group covers a wide range of arts and craft related subjects, having held workshops on such diverse subjects as leaf printing, mosaics, paper marbling, Christmas wreath making, calligraphy and lino cutting as well as painting and drawing and many other topics. We have also had presentations on arts related subjects and have visited galleries, exhibitions, and

museums. Recent projects have included free-form tapestry weaving, dry point printing and the setting up of a recorder group for both beginners and more experienced players.

We have lots of ideas for future activities, some new and some revisiting previous topics and would like to extend our range to perhaps embrace theatre and concert visits.



There is no restriction on membership, and all are welcome at all meetings and workshops although numbers may sometimes have to be limited because of space and availability of materials. We would especially welcome anyone who has any knowledge or skill in an arts related subject that they would be willing to share with others.

The workshops rarely cost more than two or three pounds which covers the hiring of the hall and some basic materials, although we sometimes call on the skills of more professional artists which may incur greater expense. No previous knowledge or ability in art is required and most of the time we just have fun and enjoy the experience of creating something, even if it sometimes turns out to be less beautiful than we hoped. A bit like being back in primary school when you got to play with paint, paper, and crayons and nobody judged the results!

PILLATON FOR SALE

This would undoubtedly have been the headline in the Village News 100 years ago detailing the most momentous event that had occurred in Pillaton for centuries. This was the sale of the Newton Ferrers Estate, which included most of the properties in Pillaton and took place in Goldings Hotel, in Callington on Wednesday 15 October 1924.

The estate had been owned by Mr Thurstan Collins JP who died in May 1924 aged 66. For many years he had lived in Newquay working as a solicitor, but then came 1916, which proved to be a very tragic year. In January his father, Digby Collins who had been High Sheriff of Cornwall, passed away prompting Thurstan to return to the Newton Ferrers Estate to manage affairs. Then that summer both his sons were killed in action during WW1, within three months of each other, Gerald at Jutland, and Percy on the Somme; both names being recorded on our War Memorial.

Thurstan Collins' funeral took place in Pillaton on 4 June 1924. However, he had no male heirs and his two daughters, who were already married and living elsewhere, were unwilling to take on the management of the estate. Thus, the executors of his will took the decision to sell the estate which had been valued at around £85,000 and encompassed properties across four parishes, St Mellion, St Ive, Quethiock and of course Pillaton. At the sale most of the properties in Pillaton went to local buyers and some of the key auction results were as follows:

Rick Park Farm 40 acres £1,200; Pillaton Mill 11 acres £600;

Pillaton Barton Farm 167 acres £3,250; Lower Trewashford Farm 49 acres £1,175,

Trewashford Farm 114 acres £not given, Higher Kernock Cottage £90, Washing Place £75, Cottage with carpenter & wheelwright's shop £265, Village Post Office £156.

Royal Oak pub (Weary Friar) £605. 10 other cottages in Pillaton fetched between £30 & £130.

Although 1924 may have been a momentous year for Pillaton, surprisingly I have

found very little else reported about the village in the newspapers apart from some hunting news and a cricket match against Landrake!

Elsewhere there was a bit more happening. In Britain, 1924 was a year of two Prime Ministers. In January, following a vote of no confidence in the government Ramsay MacDonald came to power as the first Labour Prime Minister with a minority government only to be replaced at the General Election nine months later by the Conservative Stanley Baldwin. This election also saw the previous sitting MP Isaac Foot, replaced by the Conservative Gerald Harrison as the MP for Bodmin. Internationally, in April Adolf Hitler was imprisoned for his part in the failed Munich Beer Hall Putsch the previous November and during his 9 months of captivity he wrote 'Mein Kampf' which become the blueprint of Nazi thinking. Meanwhile the fascists under Mussolini were strengthening their hold in Italy. That summer the Olympics (*the Chariots of Fire ones*) were held in Paris whilst London saw the opening of the British Empire Exhibition in Wembley.

PILLATON VILLAGE HALL

With the welcome influx of quite a few new residents to the village in the last year or more, an update on the village's great asset, the Village Hall, might be helpful.

The Village Hall started life in 1838 as the village school. In about 1955 the school was closed and, after remaining unused for a while, the building was taken over as the village hall. Subsequently it has been refurbished and extended.

The Village Hall is managed by a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) set up in 2017, evolving from the previous management committee, now with 12 Trustees who run the day to day business the organisation. The trustees meet on a quarterly schedule.

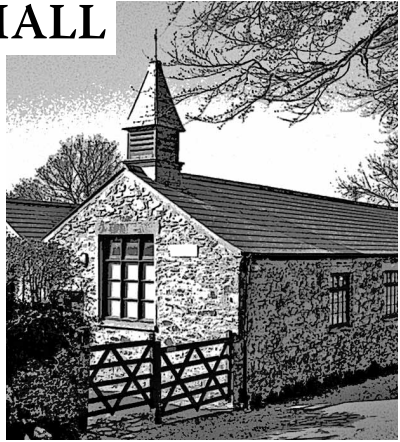
The objects of the CIO are the provision and maintenance of a village hall for the use of the inhabitants of Pillaton, without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, including use for:

- Meetings, lectures and classes, and
- Other forms of recreation and leisure-time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants.

The CIO submits an annual report and statement of accounts to the Charity Commission of England and Wales. 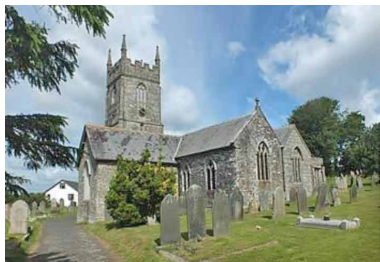

KEEP ST MELLION CLOCK CHIMING

We desperately need your help in raising £10,000 to keep St Mellion village clock chiming.

Water creeping down the church tower wall from the belfry has caused the floor and the timber support beneath to rot. Although the entry of water into the tower has now been stopped, the clock room floor is unsafe. A temporary solution to allow the clock to be wound in the short term has been found but a permanent alternative needs to be put in place.

Plans have not yet been finalised, but rotten timber must be replaced and additional support must be built into the wall below the floor to provide support to the remaining solid timber.

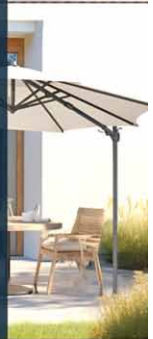
