### VILLAGE NEWS ADVERTISING – INCREASE IN CHARGES

The Village News normally raises around £600 a year from advertising which covers the cost of printing, with the surplus going towards upkeep of the Village Hall. The printing is most generously undertaken by Kernock Park Plants but as everyone will be aware prices have been steadily rising, and this includes printing. Therefore, to ensure advertising revenue continues to make a healthy contribution towards Village Hall funds, the charge for placing advertisements in the newsletter will be subject to a small increase. For the smaller size adverts the increase will be £1 per issue and £2 for a full-page advertisement with discounts for full year subscriptions. The new schedule of advertising rates is set out on page 27, with the new charges to be implemented as subscriptions are renewed.

Just in case anyone thinks this is all a bit of shameless profiteering charges have never changed during my 15 years as editor and, as far as I can see, the last price increase took place around the time of the Millennium!

Cllr Dolley (Chairman) confirmed that the website served a duo purpose of maintaining Council Agendas and Minutes, and serving residents who wished to advertise local events on the website.

#### UPDATE ON CLERK APPOINTMENT

Cllr Dolley (Chairman) stated that applications for the post of Clerk & RFO should be directed to him by the closing date 15 April 2024. Chris Cook (Locum) Clerk agreed to Clerk for the period May to July if required.

PLANNING PERMISSION None.

### <u>FINANCE</u>

a) Approval of Invoice payments were noted.

b) The Bank balance end of February 2024 was reconciled to £4,905.

c) The Accounts were presented for the year ending 31 March 2024 with a balance to carry forward of £3,953.31 were agreed.

### ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Several Councillors noted the increasing number of potholes in the Village. Cllr Johnson stated that individuals can report these matters enquiries@ cornwallcouncil.gov.uk or Highways Cornwall. A dedicated site is available for reporting and Cllr Johnson has lodged several complaints.

Cllr Warne (Vice Chair) confirmed that Pillaton Parish Council were awaiting a response from St. Mellion Parish Council concerning the overgrown pear hedge around the border of Clapper Bridge which required trimming. The St. Mellion Parish Councillor in attendance noted this matter for action.

#### **ELECTIONS**

Cllr Dolley was elected to serve as Chairman and Cllr Warne as Vice Chair, both to serve until 1 May 2025.

#### MINUTES

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 2 April 2024 and the Annual Meeting held on 2 May 2023 were accepted unanimously.

MATTERS ARISING None

PLANNING APPLICATIONS Two received.

#### **FINANCE**

a) <u>Payments</u> The council agreed payment of £386.41 to Zurich Municipal (Insurance Policy premium renewal).

b) <u>Finance Resolutions</u> The council resolved to approve the statutory Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) reports, which will be posted on the village website.

c) <u>Governance</u> The Council agreed to adopt National Association of Local Councils (NALC) Standing orders and Financial Regulations, General Power of Competence, and also the Model Publications Scheme (MPC), which outlines all the information required to be made available about the working of the parish council; the MPC to be posted on the website.

<u>PARISH CLERK</u> Following the retirement of Dick Woodley as Parish Clerk candidates for the post were interviewed by the Parish Council during the course of two extraordinary meetings held on 23 and 30 April. Following the interviews councillors unanimously agreed to offer Christopher Cook the position of Parish Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer at an initial salary of £1800 per annum commencing 1 May 2024.

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman delivered his annual report, which will be placed on the website.

<u>WEBSITE</u> The situation is still under review with the options being to continue with the present arrangement with a volunteer still being sought to take over its running, or to adopt a commercial model provided by Westernweb Limited.

REPAIRS AND REFURBISHMENT

a) <u>Village Bench</u> The bench opposite the Old Post Office is in need of some repair and an estimate for the work required will be sought.

b) <u>Refuse Bin</u> The refuse bin situated at the Playing Field is rusting away and an estimate will be obtained for its repair or repair or replacement.

c) <u>Telephone Box</u> The council approved the sum of £285 for the repainting of the phone box.

#### CORRESPONDENCE

Hedge trimming St Mellion Parish Council have responded regarding the need for hedge trimming on the way to Clapper Bridge, stating the situation would be kept under review, but no action was required at present.

20 mph speed limit Communication has been received from Cormac regarding the new 20 mph speed limits being rolled out countywide. As far as Pillaton is concerned, although no timescale given as yet, the 20 mph speed limit would have the same boundaries as the existing 30 mph speed limit zone.

<u>ANY OTHER BUSINESS</u> The situation with regard to the beech tree in the churchyard was raised and the posible danger of it falling on the Village hall. The Chairman reported the tree was the responsibility of the Parochial Church Council *(editor's note - report on page 7 also refers)*.

## LONG SERVING PARISH CLERK LEAVES

On Sunday 28 April a small presentation was held in the Village Hall to mark the retirement of Dick Woodley from the post of Parish Clerk on the Parish Council.

Dick moved to Pillaton in the late 1960s and one of his first contributions to village life was to set up a youth club in Pillaton. He first became Parish Clerk in 1982, stepping down four years later in 1986 to hand over to Delcia Miles, although he continued to work as a Parish Councillor. He returned as Parish Clerk

in 1998 and served the Council until March this year, before finally deciding to retire having taken the decision to downsize and move from the village.

At the presentation Chairman Dave Dolley thanked Dick for his sterling efforts and contribution over the course of his 30 years service as Parish Clerk. By way of a small thank-you Dave presented Dick with a bottle of single malt whisky on behalf of the Parish Council, together with a small request that he might be allowed to share the bottle!

## **CHERRY FEAST 2024**

Although most long-term residents know about the Cherry Feast, many of those who have recently moved to the area might like a short explanation. The Cherry Feast is a community fete which raises money to support the Fabric Fund of the two Grade 1 listed churches of St Mellion and Pillaton.



Its history goes back to when cherries grew throughout the Tamar Valley; after the harvest, the locals would get together for a celebration. In more recent times it has taken on the form of a traditional village fete with stalls, teas, and entertainments.

This year the Cherry Feast will take place on Sunday 7 July between 1 pm and 5 pm at Bush Farm, just outside Pillaton. Once again, we will have a Dog Show as well. We plan to have a wonderful day, but we do need some help. Marquees and tents need to be set up on the evening of Friday 5 July, hopefully not much needs to be done on Saturday but on the Sunday, we will need help running stalls, supervising the car park, or serving in the tea tent. And of course, everything has to be cleared up at the end of the day.

Ahead of the day we will need donations of bottles for the wine wheel, contributions for the cake stall, tea tent, book stall, plant stall and Pretty Things. Please contact me if you are willing to get involved.

### THE BEECH TREE

In recent months there has been some concern in the village about the condition of the churchyard beech tree which overhangs the road by the village hall. A survey carried out in 2023 had suggested that some of the weight should be taken off the tree, but this was contested by a range of professionals including the Diocesan arboriculture consultant Keith Rushforth, a legally approved expert witness. It was suggested that taking any material off the tree would most likely lead to infections and overall weakening of the tree which in turn could affect the adjacent trees. Mr Rushforth was convinced that the tree was sound but suggested that to allay concerns it could be regularly monitored with quarterly photographs; the Parochial Church Council (PCC) is now doing this. The PCC also decided to undertake a PICUS tomograph survey which assesses the density of the wood within the trunk. The results of this survey indicated that the trunk was 100% wood and showed no sign of decay. Obviously, the PCC will continue to monitor the condition of all the churchyard trees but at the present time they consider no remedial action is required on the beech tree.

### ST. MELLION WITH PILLATON ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING - 21 APRIL 2024

Lesley Valiant welcomed those attending the APCM.

#### ANNUAL VESTRY MEETING

One nomination, Vivienne Malsom, had been received for the position of Churchwarden to serve the parish and operate in both St Mellion and Pillaton churches. Proposed by Ann Henderson, seconded by Sue McClaughry, and unanimously approved. Vivienne Malsom was duly elected to serve as Churchwarden for the year 2024-25.

Pam Lowther will remain Churchwarden of St. Odulph, Pillaton, until 3 June 2024.

The vestry meeting was then closed.

### ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

**1. Minutes of APCM held 21 March 2023:** Agreed as a true record and signed by Lesley Valiant.

#### 2. Matters Arising: None

**3. Presentation of Annual Report and accounts 2023:** This had been previously displayed on the website, the Pillaton and St. Mellion Pillaton Hub Facebook pages, and emailed to individual members of the congregation. Printed copies were available to those attending the APCM.

Sue McClaughry, Treasurer, presented the accounts, highlighting issues of concern. She explained that the allocation of monies to accounts is different due to the card reader and cessation of giving by envelopes. Admin expenses are higher due to needing to pay for retired clergy to officiate during the interregnum. Both churches and St. Mellion church hall are now covered by a single insurance policy. She has changed electricity supplier. In total, the church accounts now hold over £27000.00, but there are high costs in the offing.

Q. Is there any money available for re-decoration?

A. PCC will decide where necessary. Friends of St. Odulph church can help fund projects with monies raised.

Independent auditor: Nigel Cummings is willing to continue as independent auditor of the church accounts and was approved by the meeting.

4. Nominations for PCC: Three eligible nominations had been received; from

Anne James, proposed by Vivienne Malsom; Ann Jeal, proposed by Ann Henderson and seconded by Vivienne Malsom; Annette Rickard, proposed by Pam Lowther and seconded by Vivienne Malsom.

**5. Election of members to the PCC:** The above nominees were voted onto the PCC by the attendees to the APCM.

As the other PCC members were willing to serve for another year they were voted in "en bloc". PCC members for 2024-25 are therefore as follows:

Jim Bennet, Alison Downing, Anne James, Ann Jeal, Annette Rickard, Ann Henderson, (Secretary), Terry Valiant, Sue McClaughry, (Treasurer), and Clare Page, (Safeguarding Officer).

Lesley also asked members of the congregation to volunteer as sides persons, to help get the church ready for services, meet and greet, and tidy up afterwards.

**Deanery Synod:** The term of office for Deanery Synod runs for 3 years from 1 July 2023. Sue McClaughry will continue to serve, there are vacancies for 2 more representatives.

**6. Safeguarding Policy:** The Benefice Safeguarding Policy has been reviewed prior to the Annual meeting and agreed "Fit for purpose" by the PCC. Clare Page outlined a few points, indicating the PCC has attained a good level of awareness of safeguarding issues. Vivienne has still to complete her leader's training by June. New PCC members will be asked to complete Basic Awareness training. Lesley asked anyone with concerns about safeguarding issues to inform Clare.

7. Any Other Business: Vivienne Malsom said a few words about the teamwork that has kept the churches alive following Revd. Chris Painter's departure last year. She thanked Lesley Valiant for her hard work, officiating at weddings, funerals and regular services, as well as her pastoral visits. She also thanked Sarah for the church music; Graham Palmer and Brian Henderson for "behind the scenes" work; Evelyn Brewer and Kirsteen Mims for drawing up rotas of readers and intercessors; the bell-ringers; coffee makers; Friends of St. Odulph; Malcolm Smith for his help with fabric and Health and Safety; Pam Lowther for her work as Churchwarden; the PCC; Ann Henderson for her work as Secretary; Clare Page for her work as Safeguarding Officer; Alison Downing for organising "one-off" social events; Jim Bennet for his amazing fundraising efforts; and Terry Valiant.

She told everyone that the Diocese has started the advertising process to appoint a new incumbent, and reassured everyone that the Rural Dean doesn't want to close churches!

Alison Downing proposed a vote of thanks to Vivienne herself for all her hard work during a difficult year.


