Peafowl Update

The following update from Chris Ley was posted on Pillaton Facebook page on 21 August:

"A survey of the Village was undertaken in late June and early July because the Parish Council stated that they had no powers to intervene in this potentially contentious issue.

For a number of reasons, there has been a pause in activity following the survey. However, in view of the concern from residents that peafowl should be rehomed (overwhelmingly so in Barton Meadow), a letter has now been sent to Cornwall Council Environmental Protection requesting them to formally investigate the issue. I will provide updates on progress.

As many of you may be aware, on Tuesday the peahen was discovered outside a garage in Barton Meadow with 3 chicks. After moving among 3 other properties, the chicks were captured by concerned residents and together with peahen moved to shelter in Briars Ryn."



2019 Rainfall



The wet weather continued through December with 213mm (8.39") of rain. This was sufficient to ensure that 2019 beat the previous wettest year total of 2012 by about 8mm (0.33"). Although the roads through the village at times were streaming with run-off water, we did not experience the more widespread inundation across the River Lynher floodplain as happened in December 2012.
