PILLATON VILLAGE HALL FLOOR

As I am sure most readers of the Village News would know, the Pillaton Village Hall CIO has been involved in litigation with the flooring contractor who laid the Village Hall floor in January 2017. Almost immediately after laying, serious problems emerged. It was the contention of the CIO that the contractor was in breach of contract in that the floor had been laid without reasonable care and skill. Although confirmed by an independent expert flooring inspector, the contractor maintained that there was no fault on his part and the issues were caused by endemic faults with the building.

On 8 August, the matter went to trial at Torquay County Court and the Judge ruled against the contractor awarding the CIO damages and costs. Although the CIO generously allowed the contractor 14 extra days in addition to that set by the judge, he failed to submit payment. It was only subsequent to a High Court enforcement writ and its issue by officers that payment has now been received.

The CIO is now actively seeking quotations from reputable hardwood floor contractors to lay a replacement floor. It is hoped that rectification will be undertaken in the new year. However, such activity is dependent on costs and contractors' schedules.

I will provide updated information when quotations have been considered by the CIO.


